TAKE YOUR ACCOUNTS WHEREVER YOU GO!

These days we do almost everything on our phone from ordering food and purchasing goods, to watching funny or educational videos and managing our finances. Community Financial is making it easier to take your money with you wherever you go. Our convenient mobile banking app lets you do more than just check your balances. Here are some updated features of Community Financial's mobile banking app that you can start using today.

Card Features: The new card controls feature allows you to block, unblock, cancel and reorder your cards as-needed. If you're heading out of town, you'll also have the option to submit your travel plans. This will help track any unusual activity during your trip. For extra added security you can also sign up for real time **fraud alerts** within your mobile banking app, helping to keep you and your money safe!

Password Reset: We know sometimes it's not always easy to remember a password, so now you can reset your password within your mobile banking app. The **reset password** link will show up on the log-in page on the bottom left hand side.

Pay Bills: We won't let you forget to pay your next bill when you use eBills with our ePay service. Our ePay system will now notify you when a new eBill is available for review. There is no need to leave the app to see your balance due or worry about missing a payment. For our mortgage members, you can now conveniently transfer payments to your Community Financial Mortgage from the transfer menu.

Get a copy of your check: You can view your checks that have cleared and even share them if needed.

Remote Deposit Capture: If you can't get to the branch you can deposit your check through the mobile app. We've increased the limit to make it more convenient for our members.

Face ID: Depending on your phone, you can use Face ID with our mobile app, allowing extra security in keeping the information on your phone safe.

Community Financial partners with the Michigan Credit Union League Foundation to host Reality Fairs at local high schools throughout Michigan. In 2019, we extended this program to Tinkham Alternative High School and Hillman High school. This financial learning experience brings one month of independent adult living into a 90 minute session teaching/providing students with real world financial experience. During these simulations students are given a salary and a credit score. They then visit twelve stations to make choices to obtain the goods and services they need to live independently, while learning to balance their budgets, with the assistance of the credit union.

Our education partnership coordinators work to teach young members the value of financial wellness and setting financial goals.
